## **Directions to Tillman Reclamation Center:**

### **Bus Directions to Tillman Reclamation Plant**

Tillman Center is located at 6100 Woodley Ave. in Van Nuys.  
The Metro Orange line stops on Woodley Ave.  
Metro bus #164 and #237 towards Burbank Blvd.  
Entrance is on the East side of the street.  
The Japanese Garden is located on the grounds.

### **Car Directions to Tillman Reclamation Plant**

From the 405 coming from the South: Exit Burbank Blvd. and go left (west). Turn right (north) on Woodley Ave. and proceed to the driveway labeled 'Japanese Garden'. (If you get to Victory, you've gone too far.) Turn right at the driveway and bear left to the parking lot for Tillman.

From the 405 coming from the North: Exit Burbank Blvd. and go right (west). Turn right (north) on Woodley Ave. and proceed to the driveway labeled 'Japanese Garden'. Turn right at the driveway and bear left to the parking lot for Tillman.

From the 101: Transition onto the 405 North and exit on Burbank Blvd. and go right (west). Turn right (north) on Woodley Ave. and proceed to the driveway labeled 'Japanese Garden'. Turn right at the driveway and bear left to the parking lot for Tillman.
